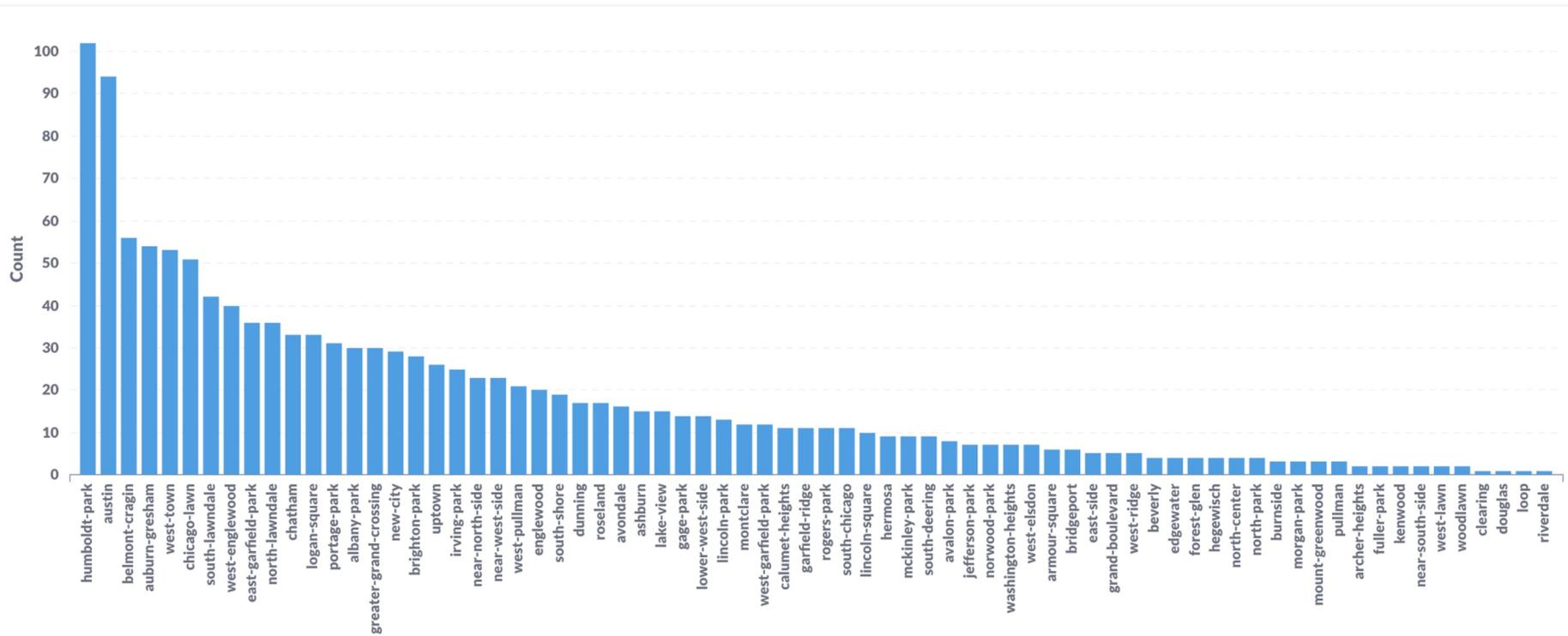

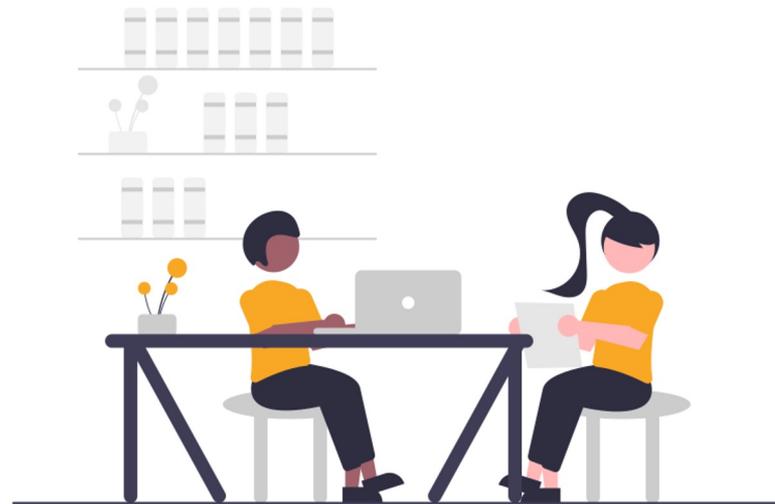




## MORE REPORTING, LOWER COSTS



Using the data portal, a single journalist can quickly determine what is happening in each neighborhood. The data dramatically increases reporting capacity while adding minimal costs.

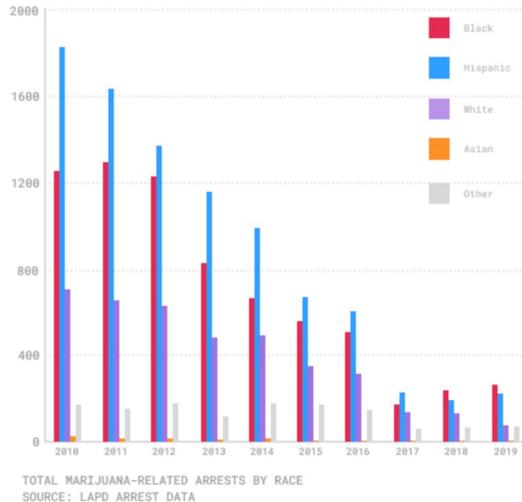




## A FOCUS ON EQUITY

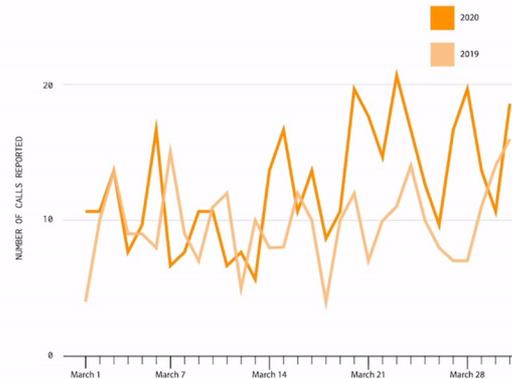

March 1-31st, 2019 vs 2020

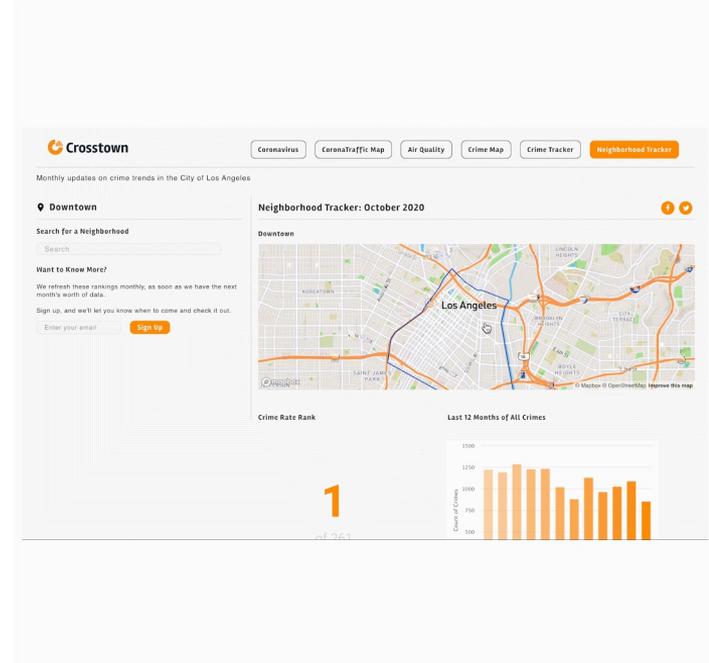

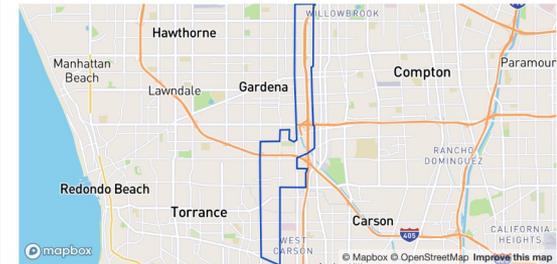

This is Gabriel Kahn. While I'm usually writing from **Fairfax**, this week I'm in Naples, Italy (it's for work, I swear).

Anyone who has tried to buy, rent or even couch-surf in **Los Angeles** knows that nothing comes cheap. The high cost of housing is at the root of so many of our local issues, from homelessness to the general lack of affordability which is [chasing people out of the region](https://laist.com/news/40-percent-of-california-residents-said-theyre-considering-leaving-the-state-most-say-theyre-being-priced-out).

Crosstown recently reported on the slow pace of construction for new buildings and the flat number of demolitions taking place—both are flashing red lights about the city's capacity to add to its housing stock in the near future.

But there is one bright spot, and it's this:

**7,621**

That's the number of **accessory dwelling units** permitted during the past 12 months (May 1, 2023–April 30, 2024). Better known as ADUs, these are the [usually modest apartments](https://xtown.la/2022/09/20/adus-los-angeles-housing-numbers/) in a reconfigured garage or that rise in the corner of a backyard.

The year 2023 was the best on record, with **7,513** permits issued.

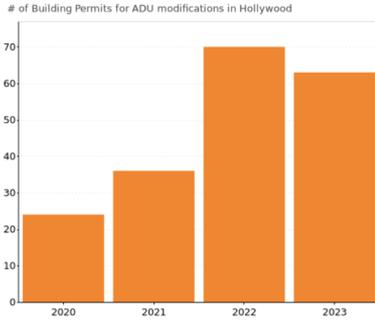

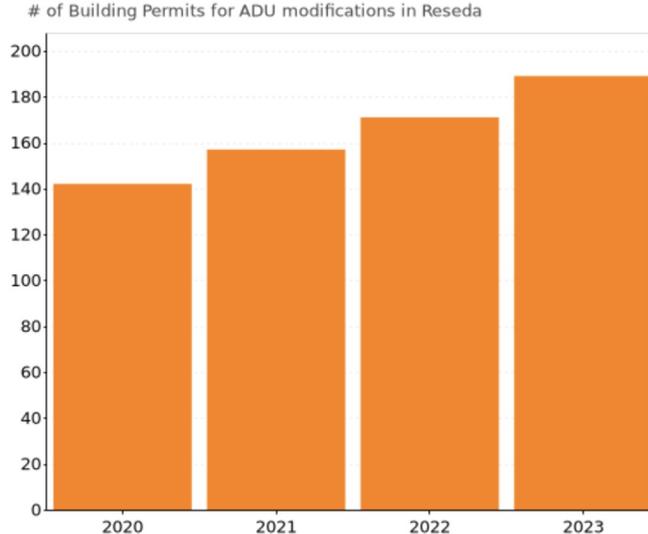

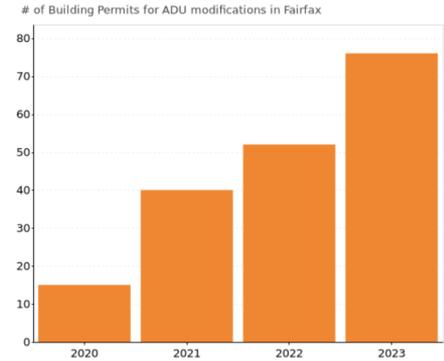

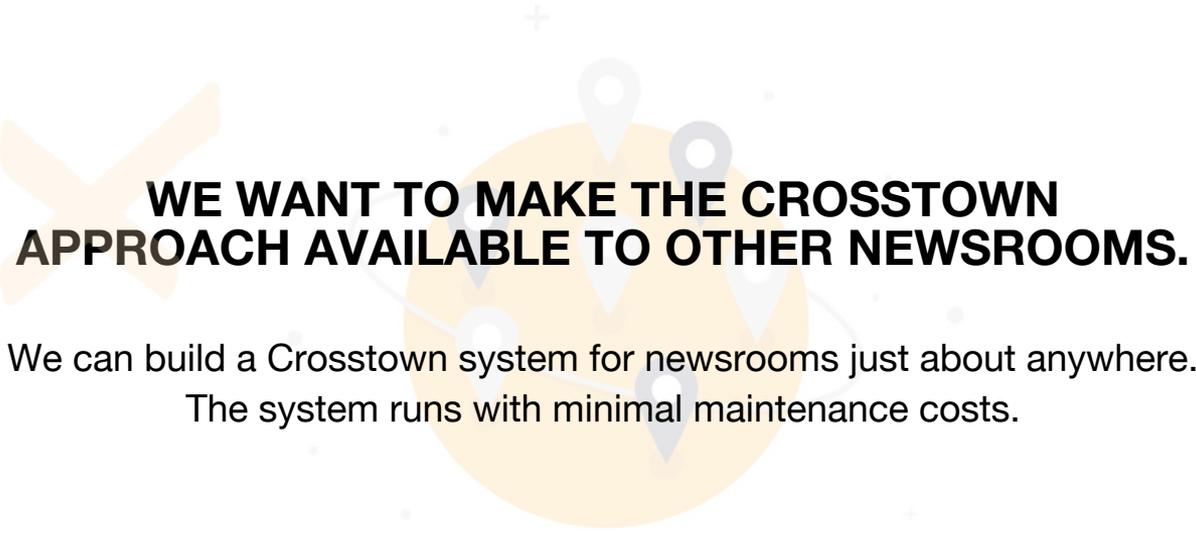
